Dear Friends of Marquette Park Members,

We thank you for your generous support of Friends of Marquette Park. We surpassed our 100-member goal with 111 Charter Members by May 18, 2017, in our first year of existence! The 1st Annual meeting/Celebration of Friends of Marquette Park brought 75 Charter Members and guests to the Father Marquette Statue Garden for a delightful event. Each attendee represented a bush planted at the garden!

Updates on our projects:

Liners in beach cans and beach clean-ups: Thank you volunteers! Our volunteer program is working well with 30 residents who help monitor the beach cans and make sure there is always room in the cans for more trash. We also support beach clean-up days.

Kid Alert Green Men: We securely installed more "little green men" to protect walkers and cyclists at crosswalks. We will install new orange flags to bring attention to the crosswalks.

Landscaping and hardscaping at Father Marquette Memorial Garden: Volunteers replaced 75 bushes and spread two truckloads of mulch in May. Pruning of all shrubs, repairing damaged cement, controlling erosion on slopes with new plantings, and maintaining the irrigation system have been accomplished. Volunteers are always working in the garden area. Fr. Marquette Garden Work Days are the second Tuesday and second Saturday of each month from 9:00 AM - noon. Come join us!

Landscaping of lagoon area: Invasive plants that obstructed the view of the lagoon have been removed. We are getting ready to plant 50+ native plants along the east edge of the Lagoon. Our naturalist, Sandy O'Brien, is caring for the seedlings until planting day.

Preventing erosion between the sidewalk and the fore dune: We continue to work with the city and Parks Department on solutions that improve access to the beach and protect the walkway and stairs.

Summer Youth Work Program: With gifts designated the Youth Work Program, Friends of Marquette Park volunteers accomplished many tasks while working with five young people four hours per day for six weeks. George, Carol, Susan, Karen, Dawn, Linda, Zully and Corya helped oversee the workers Whew!

Safety Stations: A new project spearheaded by Mary Ann Best, is installing Safety Stations at each easement along the entire beach and the lagoon. The stations include a instructional sign, life ring with tow line and life jacket to aid in helping swimmers in distress. Within one month, Mary Ann has commitments for the funding of 35 Safety Stations. Friends of Marquette Park accepts donations designated for Safety Stations and replacement items. What a terrific project and fantastic response from our community!

Barriers for protection: We are looking into barriers to protect the electrical boxes and historic street light from damage and at the same time provide an aesthetically pleasing addition to our park. **Repair of wall and steps to the beach north of Shelter 3:** We will work with the city for a solution.

Parks Department is working on solutions:

Turf grass established south of Shelter 3: Visitors have more grassy space while using the large shelter.

Planters at Pavilion and Shelter 5: Beautiful seasonal plantings are maintained by the Parks staff. **Do Not Enter and Stay of Grass signs installed**: The signs do make a difference.

Striping of streets, bike lanes, and bike icons: Motorists can clearly see the bike lane and boundaries.

New equipment to remove trash on beach: Equipment is repaired, and we hope to see improvement.

Events in the Park: **Taco Tuesdays** on the Aug. 22, & Sept.12 at the Pavilion, Movies in the Park on the 4th Fridays, and "As You Like It" performed by Gary Shakespeare every Sunday in August. **Mary Jane's Café**: Ken Houseworth is providing food, ice cream, beverages and music at the Montgomery Street Concession Stand. Stop by for some tasty treats.

Beach Clean-Up Days: City of Gary Day of Caring with United Way brings regional volunteers, city staff, and local volunteers together to clean up our park and beach. The next Clean-Ups are Sept. 7 with United Way and NIPSCO, 9:00 – noon; Sept. 17 with IUNW and Adopt –a-Beach 8:30 – 12:30.

The Parks Department is addressing:

- •removal of sand from Lake Street Beach parking lot and replenish sand in playground area
- erosion control north of concession stand near Montgomery Street
- •replacement of streetlights and globe light fixtures at Area 5 and replacement bulbs when needed.

Long-Term Projects:

- •Promoting most southern point of Lake Michigan as a destination
- •Involvement in redevelopment of Lake Street Beach
