
Memorial Bench Project Phase III

FMP Projects

Plants and People Indigenous to Marquette Park - FMP Leaders have met with Ezekiel Flannery, PhD who talked to us about wild edibles/medicinals, ethnobotany and the Native American history of the area. We are considering ways to share his wealth of knowledge with you. Archie Patterson has developed some podcasts about indigenous people's history here. We are seeking a platform to publicize his work. We are planning to

Street Light Replacement - The City of Gary has begun replacing street lights in the City. We are keeping in touch with the City Engineer to make sure the streets around Marquette Park are included in the project. This includes the four historic street lights that have been on our list for the City to replace since 2018. At this point, the contractors have replaced the bulbs to keep our park lit. We are still waiting for the street lights to be replaced. Accessible Beach Walkway - A long-term goal is to fund a walkway so that everyone can experience the beach, regardless of their abilities. We will continue to pursue this project. Park Board Meetings - FMP has a presence at Park Board of Commissioners meetings every two weeks. We advocate for our community and the needs in Marquette Park at each meeting. We seek approval for our projects through the Park Board.

Bird Yard Art Silent Auction at FMP Annual Meeting - Miller Garden Club partnered with FMP to successfully raise funds for public Art. The proud owners of bird yard art donated over \$2,700 toward the purchase of Tall Ship II.
