We added ten (10) more decorative boulders in strategic places to protect electrical utility boxes and sand dunes. There are now thirteen boulders doing their job of looking good and preventing expensive damage. It's working!

We have our sights on several more places where boulders would help protect areas in the park.

Solar Powered LED Crosswalk Signs

Our "little green men" keep walking away and needed an upgrade. Two flashing crosswalk signs have been installed near the concession stand and at the top of the hill between going south on Grand Ave. Hopefully, the signs will help slow down traffic and keep pedestrians safe.

Statue Garden and Lagoon Area Landscaping

We continue to replenish plants and bushes and maintain the gardens. This year we had funds and in-kind gifts to pay for removal of leaves and edging of the lawn. This saved the backs of our volunteers. We always need volunteers to help with gardening. Come join us.

Water Safety Program

The Centennial Water Safety program through the American Red Cross is providing much needed support and training for our lifeguards and first responders. This training deals with open water rescues that are much different than guarding a pool.
