


LIGHTS ARE BRIGHTER ON OUR STATUE

Once we replaced the lights shining on the Fr. Marquette Statue, it really made a difference. During the fall of 2019, we had the spotlights on the monument and hardscape replaced with LED lights. The brightness was noticeable; however, the actual statue was dimly lit. The spotlights were replaced with even more power to Pierre Marquette. Once again, Great Lakes Ltd. came to the rescue. The holiday lights and wreath added to the joy of the season. Thank you to the volunteers who decorated the trees with lights and Fr. Marquette with the wreath.

STAY OFF THE SHELF ICE

The ice on the lake, shelf ice, may form at some point. Be aware that it is not safe to walk on. It is very difficult to know where the shore ends and the water begins. It deceptively looks like part of the shoreline, but there is water underneath. If you fall in, you may not be rescued. The ice can be less than a foot high to over 30' high. When you fall in the water, you will most likely not find the hole to come back up, IF you survive the freezing water. When you see someone on the shelf ice, inform them of the danger. Many just don't know.

FMP PROJECTS in Progress

Boulders - Thank you to Miller Garden Club for hosting "Bingo for Boulders" to raise funds for more protective boulders. We will be installing about ten boulders in the spring.

Marquette Park Trail System - This is comprised of a long and short trail. The trails will include points of interest, interpretive signage, accessible information, distances between points and directions from point to point. The sites are: Concession Stand (with trails map), Patterson Island, Lagoon, Lagoon Boat Launch, Octave Chanute Marker, Fr. Marquette Statue, Chanute Trail, Stone Gates, Nelson-Algren Trail and Pavilion.

Historic Street Lights - We are working with the City to replace the street lights on Grand Ave. in the park. We have lost four lights and poles. The goal is completion in 2020.

Historic Landmark Registry for Fr. Marquette Statue/Marquette Park. We are supporting Brad Miller's efforts to apply for Indiana and National Landmark status.

The Pavilion bridge between the main building and outdoor dance patio is in need of major repair. FMP is assisting the Park Dept. in getting professional advice and estimates to repair the bridge. It is critical to solve the problem that caused the damage and provide a safe and beautiful structure. We will continue to push and work with the City to invest in the repairs for the historic Pavilion.
