HABITAT IMPROVEMENT PROJECT IN PROGRESS


Sandy O'Brien is working hard to remove invasive species in the globally rare fore-dune habitat area along Lake Michigan's coastline south of the Chanute Trail and north of the lagoon. She received a grant from USFWS with City of Gary's partnership to restore the 17 acres. Part of the grant included a generous donation of \$5,000. Work to eliminate invasive plants and trees, seeding of native plants and erosion control will continue through spring of 2021. The grant totals \$12,500.00. Many thanks to Sandy for acquiring the grant to restore and protect a rare area of Marquette Park.

MARQUETTE PARK TRAIL SYSTEM

Plans are for four trails (short, long, accessible & beach). The trails will include points of interest, interpretive signage, accessible information, distances between points and directions from point to point. The signage will be similar to those at the Shirley Heinze Bayless Dunes Trail in Miller. The sites are: Concession Stand (with trails map), Patterson Island, Lagoon, Lagoon Boat Launch, Octave Chanute Marker, Chanute Trail, Stone Gates, Nelson-Algren Trail and Pavilion. We have discovered a new surprise attraction to add to a trail! Watch for more news as we move ahead with our plans. We are getting ready to share our plans with the City and Park Board to receive approval. We are planning to partner with Legacy Foundation and Shirley Heinze Land Trust on this project.



CONGRATULATIONS TO WATER SAFETY SOCIAL GROUP!!



The Miller Beach Water Safety Social Group (WSS) was honored to be awarded an American Water Environmental Grant of \$2000.00. We would like to thank Holly True and Justin Mount of Indiana American Water for these funds as well as forming a new partnership with them to help spread this message.

The WSS's mission is to coordinate and focus community resources and energies on infrastructure and programs to educate the community to mitigate the risks to life and limb posed by activities on or near the water. Water sustains and supports all life on earth. With an American Water Environmental Grant, your community or community-based organization can lend the water supply or watershed a helping hand by working to improve, restore or protect it.

The American Water's environmental grants support innovative, community-based environmental projects that improve, restore and/or protect watersheds and community water supplies through partnerships. This program was started in 2005 and is nationwide.

The two missions go hand in hand. We adapted our program to be titled RESPECT AND PROTECT THE LAKE.

The goal of this presentation is to share the importance of protecting yourself AND our fresh water resources - Lake Michigan and the Great Lakes Basin for Indiana. We feel it is so very important that our Miller Beach community, surrounding areas and visitors are aware of the importance of both - knowing when and how to safely engage in swimming and water sports in the lake as well as how vital it is to keep the lake and the lake basin clean.

The grant monies have and will be used to educate NWI youth, their families and visitors on the importance of respecting and protecting Lake Michigan's water cycle. We have developed our friendly characters, Cory, Sandy, Millie, and Gary to help us tell this story. They will help us relay facts and practical solutions that can be used everyday. Interactive presentations and displays focus on safe and contaminant free recreation. We had three presentations this past summer and reached over 100 people. During COVID - that is not too bad. We engaged Great Lakes Surf and Rescue to present and share information. We were on the Chicago news stations that helped us bring awareness to the whole viewing audience. This Grant money will continue to be used into the early summer of 2021.
